### Demography Library News

#### Change in Library Services

**FacultyEXPRESS** is a service offered by the Penn Library to standing, tenure-track faculty. FacultyExpress will: (1) Deliver circulating Penn Library materials (books, videos, etc.) to faculty members’ departmental administrative offices or any campus library. (2) Provide web delivery of articles, papers, and book excerpts (50 page limit) from the Penn collections. (3) Obtain and deliver material not available in the Penn Library collections. **What this means for PSC Research Associates:** The Demography Library staff will no longer obtain books for research associates, because this service is already provided by the Penn Libraries. We will however continue to provide scanning services for book chapters, and will continue to obtain or create PDFs for journal articles requested by research associates.

A list of research associates’ journal articles, books, and book chapters published from 2007 onward is now available online in the [PSC Publications Database](#) and on individual profile pages. The Publications database is searchable and links to full-text, includes PMCIDs when applicable, and the content is downloadable to reference/citation management software such as Endnote, RefWorks, or BibTex.
